## 2018 PARLIAMENTARY ELECTIONS AND PRE-ELECTORAL COALITIONS IN IRAQ

2018 is anticipated to be year full of elections in Iraq. It has been decided that the parliamentary elections which are the first elections of the year will be held on 12 May 2018. The idea of holding the provincial and district elections simultaneously with the parliamentary elections was previously brought to the agenda. The groups supporting the postponement of the parliamentary elections applied to the Federal Supreme Court of Iraq regarding the election date. The court acknowledged that the elections would be held on 12 May 2018 while it did not render a decision on the provincial and district elections. It was later accepted by the Iraqi Parliament that the local elections would be held on 22 December 2018.

The idea of holding the provincial and district elections simultaneously with parliamentary elections was previously brought to the agenda. The groups supporting the postponement of the parliamentary elections applied to the Federal Supreme Court of Iraq regarding the election date. The court acknowledged that the elections would be held on 12 May 2018 while it did not render a decision on the provincial and district elections. It was later accepted by the Iraqi Parliament that the local elections would be held on 22 December 2018. Besides these elections, the presidential and parliamentary elections of Kurdistan Regional Government (KRG) are expected to be held in 2018. Although the date of elections has not yet officially accepted, they are anticipated to be held in the last months of 2018

### Output of 2018 Election Law

When compared to previously held general elections, 2018 Iraqi parliamentary elections encompass several new regulations. The obligation of registration was stipulated for parties that want to take part in the elections with the new election law. Therefore, Iraq's Independent High Electoral Commission (IHEC) required all parties which previously ran for elections or which have been newly founded to apply for registration until 25 December 2017. IHEC registered 205 parties that will take part in the elections. The provisions of the new election law include regulations concerning members of parliament as well as the parties that will take part in the elections. The law envisages that the members of parliament should be graduates of at least four-year university education. Although this has been adopted in the parliament, it has aggravated the formation of candidate lists by parties. That is why an exception has been brought to 20% of the parliament in the following session of the parliament so that they will not have to be university graduates. At the same time, the quota of 25 percent allocated for women has been preserved in the Iraqi Parliament. The new election law has brought a new provision that was not previously implemented for voters. Since the elections will be held with electronic election devices, IHEC has required voters to obtain electronic voter cards Voters obtain these cards at the electronic election card offices at provincial and district centers. Furthermore, IHEC has not brought any time limit for obtaining these cards. Therefore, voters can receive electronic voter cards by going to relevant offices until the date of elections. IHEC has announced that there are 24 million voters who are entitled to vote in the elections. The participation rate was 62% in 2014 parliamentary elections. It is expected that the number of participants will increase in 2018 elections. Besides these changes, the new election law has also amended the Sainte-Lague coefficient which is the Iraqi election system. The coefficient which was 1.6 in

2014 parliamentary elections will be implemented as 1.7 in 2018 parliamentary elections. This amendment will make it more difficult for parties that might gain parliament members to gain members since the increase in the coefficient will also increase the voting rate required to have more members of parliament. In a period in which there are ongoing debates about the election law in the parliament, all provinces are required to constitute a single polling district in 2018 elections unlike the previous elections. However, this amendment has not been accepted, thus provinces will constitute separate and independent polling districts in 2018 parliamentary elections. Moreover, a serious change has been brought to the quota of minorities under the new election law. A new quota of minority has been added to Feyli Kurds in Wasit Province. Therefore, the quota allocated for minorities in the Iraqi Parliament has increased from 8 to 9. Another significant provision that has remained unchanged in the new election law is the participation of parties in the elections

The new election law has brought a new provision that was not previously implemented for voters. Since the elections will be held with electronic election devices, IHEC has required voters to obtain electronic voter cards. Voters obtain these cards at the electronic election card offices at provincial and district centers



with candidate lists that will be formed by the coalitions or the parties themselves.

### An Overview of the Provinces

Several parties have prepared common election lists by setting up coalitions with other parties in order to have seats in the parliament. On the other hand, either the coalitions including a higher number of parties have been divided or the parties withdrawing from coalitions have wished to show more candidates affiliated with them. The time limit granted for the formation of new coalitions expired on 15 February 2018. Some 7 thousand

candidates applied to take part in the elections in Iraq for 329 seats forming the Iraqi Parliament. However, the name lists were sent to the Ministry of Interior for IHEC to examine whether the candidates were engaged in committing any crime. It is expected that the definite candidate lists will be announced when the official propaganda period begins. The official propaganda period will begin on 12 April 2018, one month earlier than the elections. It is foreseen that almost 7 thousand members of parliament will participate in the elections from among 27 coalitions formed by 143 out of 205 parties. The number of seats

On the other hand, either the coalitions including a higher number of parties have been divided or the parties withdrawing from coalitions have wished to show more candidates affiliated with them.

### **Prominent Coalitions**

A separation is witnessed among the Iraqi political parties in the first elections to be held after the military defeat of ISIS. The reason of this coalition is that the military victory gained against ISIS has been turned towards the political channel and that some parties indicate that it is necessary to keep away from sectarianism which is shown as the cause of emergence of ISIS. As far as Sunni parties are concerned, there is a separation led by regional political conflicts and in terms of receiving the support of Iraqi population that has suffered from damages in the region where they live. The separation among Kurdish political parties is triggered by the independence referendum on 25 September 2017 and the federal government's regaining control in the disputed territories on 15 October 2017. Turkmens are seen as the group that largely maintains its integrity in the elections when compared to the other groups.

The separations among the minorities are mostly candidate-oriented rather than depending on political agenda since the candidate who receives the highest number of votes will be elected to the parliament in provincial polling districts.

### The Shiite

Al-Nasr Coalition: Haider al-Abadi and Nouri al-Maliki in Dawa Party will run for elections with different lists. Haider al-Abadi will take part in the elections with Victory (al-Nasr) List. Victory Coalition includes bureaucrats and politicians such as Iraqi National Security Undersecretary Falah al-Fayyadh and Foreign Minister Ibrahim al-Jaafari who are supported by a significant mass.

# State of Law Coalition: Nouri al-Maliki founded the State of Law Coalition again. Since Dawa Party took an independent position between al-Abadi and al-Maliki, it was included in none of the lists. Furthermore, al-Abadi founded the Victory Coalition instead of State of Law list, which weakened the list of al-Maliki.

Therefore, it is expected that al-Maliki will gain considerable success as in 2014 elections.

National Wisdom Movement: Ammar al-Hakim founded a new party called National Wisdom Movement (al-Hikma) by leaving the president's office at the Islamic Supreme Council of Iraq (ISCI). Although Ammar al-Hakim joined the coalition when al-Nasr Coalition was first founded, he left it since he was disturbed by the increasing number of parties in the coalition. That is why National Wisdom Movement will run for elections with its own party list, independently from the coalitions.

Sairun Coalition: Another important figure of the Shiite movement, Muqtada al-Sadr established a March Onward (Sairun) Coalition including independent candidates instead of Free (Ahrar) Bloc that he supported in the previous elections. The March Onward Coalition is formed by parties such as Sadr-supported Integrity Patriotic (İstiqama) Party and Iraqi Communist Party.

**Fatah Coalition:** Having been established by some

groups in al-Hashd al-Shaabi that has gained public support in the war won against ISIS, Fatah Coalition will participate in the elections. Al-Hashd al-Shaabi leaders such as Ahmad Asadi, Ali al-Yasiri, Khanin Qaddo and politicians like ISCI Head Humam Hamoudi take part in the coalition led by Hadi al-Amiri. Therefore, it is seen that Shiite parties will run for elections as 5 large coalitions.

### **Sunni Parties**

The Sunni also approaches the elections in dispersed groups. They will take part in the elections with 3 large coalitions in general. However, local coalitions will also play a significant role in the regions where there is an intense Sunni population.

National Alliance Coalition: National Alliance Coalition (Al-Wataniyya) established by former Iraqi Prime Minister Ayad Allawi comes first among these lists. Politicians like Speaker of Iraqi Parliament Selim al-Juburi, Sahil Mutlaq and Khamid Mutlaq are included in this coalition.

A separation is witnessed among the Iraqi political parties in the first elections to be held after the military defeat of ISIS. The reason of this coalition is that the military victory gained against ISIS has been turned towards the political channel and that some parties indicate that it is necessary to keep away from sectarianism which is shown as the cause of emergence of ISIS.

Iraqi Decision Coalition: Iraqi Decision Coalition formed by Iraqi Vice-President and Head of Muttahidun Party Usama al-Nujaifi attracts attention. Politicians such as Khamis Khanjar and Khiyid Khalbusi take part in Iraqi Decision Coalition.

Al-Anbar, Salahaddin and Baghdad Coalitions: Al-Anbar Identity, Salahaddin Identity and Baghdad Coalitions are present with the support of Al-Anbar Governor Mohammed Khalbusi. These coalitions are supported only in the mentioned provinces, by locally influential clan leaders and politicians.

### **Kurdish Parties**

The most distinctive feature of 2018 elections is the separation

of political parties further than previous years. It can be said that Kurdish parties are also influenced by this atmosphere of separation. Kurdish parties run for elections as two large coalitions and certain large parties.

## Kurdistan Democratic Party

Kurdistan Democratic Party (KDP) led by Masoud Barzani, Patriotic Union of Kurdistan (PUK) that has not yet elected its new chairman in the process after Jalal Talabani and Kurdistan Communist Party (KCPI) led by Kawa Mahmood Shaheen take part in the elections with a coalition called Kurdistan Peace List. However, KDP will not run for elections in the regions where Iraqi federal government regained control on 15 October



2017. Therefore, Kurdistan Peace List coalition will lose votes in provinces such as Mosul, Kirkuk, Salahaddin and Diyala.

National List (Listi Nishtiman): Constituting the opposition in KRG politics, Gorran, Coalition for Democracy and Justice and Kurdistan Islamic Group (Komal Islami) parties will participate in the elections with a list called Listi Nishtiman

New Generation Movement: Except for these two coalitions, New Generation Movement (Newey Nwe) established by Shahsuwar Abdulwahid request the votes of Kurdish voters. New Generation Movement will run for elections with its own party list independently from the coalitions.

### **Turkmen Parties**

Third essential element of Iraq, Turkmens take part in the elections in a more collective manner than the other groups.

Kirkuk Turkmen Front:
Turkmen parties will run for elections with a coalition called Kirkuk Turkmen Front in Kirkuk, under the leadership

of Iraqi Turkmen Front (ITF). With this coalition, Turkmens have constituted a group taking part in the elections with the most collective structure in Kirkuk. Arabs living in Kirkuk will vote for a local list such as Arab Coalition in Kirkuk and other large Arab coalitions. Kurds have also divided into different coalitions like Arabs. The most important lists are Listi Nishtiman and Kurdistan Peace List.

### **Minority Parties**

Iraqi minorities will compete among themselves for the minority quota allocated for them. Since minority seats are allocated in provincial polling districts, several minority coalitions, parties and independent candidates will compete for the seats allocated in each province. It is anticipated that some 90 candidates will compete for 9 minority seats in the Iraqi parliament.

The list including all coalitions are as below:
